TECHNICAL VOCABULARY - Evaluates and rewards the variety (depth) and complexity (range) of the technical skills presented by the ensemble, taking into consideration solos and small segments as to their percentage of the performance. Credit is given to the depth of orchestration choices with equipment and props. This caption examines and rewards the technical demands of strength, balance, flexibility and endurance needed to present the vocabulary.

TECHNICAL VOCABULARY 30 POINTS →

EXPRESSIVE VOCABULARY - Evaluates the expressive aspects of the choreography and how it relates and reflects the audio programming, taking into account effort change responsibilities motivated by the depth and range of the musical score. Areas of consideration include expressive choreography (regardless of skill levels), designed effort changes, the ability of the performers to fulfill the visual phrasing, and theatrical communication ability.

EXPRESSIVE VOCABULARY 30 POINTS →

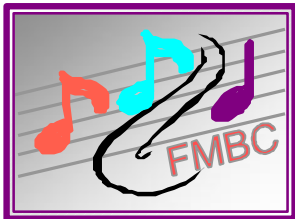
PERFORMANCE - Evaluates the clarity and quality of the performers' visual articulations with a focus on the control of time and space throughout the presentation. The caption considers the accuracy and definition of all moves, angles and pathways with the body and/or equipment and props.

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TECHNICAL VOCABULARY - Evaluates and rewards the fundamental variety (depth) and complexity (range) of the technical skills presented by all percussionists, taking into consideration solos and small segments as to their percentage of the performance. Credit is given to the depth of orchestration choices including variations in tempo and meter. This caption examines and rewards the technical demands needed to present the vocabulary.

TECHNICAL VOCABULARY 30 POINTS →

EXPRESSIVE VOCABULARY - Evaluates the expressive aspects of the percussion score and how it relates to the overall musical presentation, taking into account the demand generated by the depth and range of the musical score. Areas of consideration include expression, phrasing, and the communication of the overall musical intent. Credit is given to the depth of orchestration, choices of instruments and the appropriate choice of mallets and/or sticks.

EXPRESSIVE VOCABULARY 30 POINTS →

PERFORMANCE - Evaluates the timing, clarity, blend and balance of the percussion ensemble(s) in relationship to the overall musical presentation. Areas of consideration include control of pulse as well as accuracy and precision.

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POSTURE, PRESENCE - Evaluates and rewards the image projected to the audience. Areas of consideration include body carriage and projection of style, the selection of uniform or costume and the ability to control the overall presentation, including the ability to recover from error while maintaining the integrity of the presentation.

LEADERSHIP - Considers the projected control of the performing ensemble, including the introductory salute, music initiation commands (audible or visual), and the overall leadership qualities displayed.

FIELD CONDUCTING - Considers the style, consistency, and understanding of the musical program, and the ability of the field conductor(s) to work uniformly to effectively control the overall presentation.
